#### MINISTER'S MEDITATION

Janus, the Roman god and the origin of the name of the month of January, is the god of dualities; beginnings and endings, gates and doorways, boundaries and passages. Time was inextricably linked to motion in space. Janus, and his meaning, were invoked at the outset of every year, every month, every celebration, every day. Horace used to call him Morning Father.

Perhaps, for this month of January, we might mark the beginnings of our days by reminding ourselves that we live in endless possibility. That one day was never meant to be exactly like another. That we are in constant motion even while still – a perpetual dance through time and space. Worth an invocation, don't you think?



For thirteen-plus years, my top priority has been to build a musical community, and that begins with the singers and instrumentalists who support the music program in our church. As I write these musings, I am scheduled to have total knee replacement the end of December, and I think I'll be "off the bench" at least the first three Sundays of January.

I want to write about the "deep bench" at our church. Although I sit at the piano (and organ and keyboard), when I slide off the bench, we are blessed to have "music angels" to take up the figurative baton. I only had to ask, and they stepped up to take turns. The Chalice Choir will be on winter break in January, but the beat goes on with a collaborative and super-talented team.

On January 2, Patty and Barry Simon will be our music makers, bringing us the sweet sounds of hammered dulcimer, bass, and flutes. Patty has a collection of wind instruments: flutes, recorders, even a crumhorn. Barry is not only a talented folk musician, but also a master crafter who built his own hammered dulcimer AND his newly minted bass viol. Barry's instruments are a treat for the eyes as well as the ears!

On January 9, Ed and Andrea Priest will bring us an entire worship experience in the Ferry Beach style of inclusion and warmth. Ed has quite the collection of instruments including guitar, banjo, ukulele, and a combination of banjo and ukulele called a banjolele. Add to this the soulful power of Andrea's voice and you have magic.

On January 16, Bet Giddings will bring her YEARS of experience as a church music director. Bet is a director, pianist, and vocalist who is gifted in many styles of music including her own compositions. She's also a techie who mixed and mastered our virtual choir offerings last year. Who knows what she will come up with?!

There is a chance that my surgery date could be changed due to Covid – but please know that we have a plan, we are a team, and we will figure things out. WE ARE A MUSICAL COMMUNITY!



### MINUTES OF THE VIRTUAL PARISH COMMITTEE MEETING December 15, 2021

**Present:** Bob Waterman, Rev. Sarah Person, Lois Aldrich, Katie Allen, Nicole Sykes

**Absent:** Jim Bonnar, Marc MacQueen

Additional Attendee: Kelly Lownds

**Minister's Report:** This Sunday Rev. Sarah will be preaching on the pandemic and precautions we have taken. During fellowship, she would like to ask the congregation to break up into groups and have the congregation enter into conversations about the sermon topic as a means to "take the temperature" of the congregation regarding our church's efforts to deal with the pandemic.

The Pastoral Care and Parish Care Teams are coordinating support for several parishioners. There have been several folks from the parish who have had health issues and have accessed pastoral care. In addition to Rev. Sarah's visits to folks, many thanks are extended to Mal Marvill who has been doing a wonderful job coordinating the needs of parishioners.

Rev. Sarah talked about plans for Christmas Eve which, given the pandemic, will be a combination of live elements and prerecorded music as well as the Children's Nativity. The Christmas Eve service will be attended virtually by congregants. Rev. Sarah is considering the possibility of outdoor caroling, but this may not be possible due to the pandemic.

The PC discussed the internet outage that occurred at last week's service that "froze" the service for a period of time. However, congregants remained online. Bob Waterman suggested a Zoom co-host be assigned prior to the beginning of the service who could unmute participants and allow a time for conversation amongst congregants should another outage occur. The PC agreed with this idea, and Rev. Sarah said she will look into making this happen.

**RE:** Kelly Lownds provided the PC with updates on RE activities. RE has decorated the Christmas tree for church and had a successful holiday party last week making gingerbread houses and having pizza. RE also had a vendor cart at both the town's holiday parade and the lighting of the Christmas tree, selling popcorn, cider and cocoa. \$106 was raised at the two events. There was no parent meeting this month due to the holiday party.

For the coming year, RE will be looking at a Jesse Lewis curriculum on social/emotional growth.

Kelly reminded the PC that there will be five senior youth who will be graduating from high school in 2022 and will most likely be pursuing college. We need to think more about how to engage youth... possibly start a young adult ministry?

**Music Committee:** Rev. Sarah reminded the PC that Susan Hotchkiss is scheduled for knee surgery on December 29 and will therefore not participate in the church service for the three Sundays after that. Other arrangements have been made during her absence.

Rev. Sarah reported that the Chalice Choir will be performing at an assisted living community where two of our parishioners currently reside.

**Fundraising:** Bob Waterman reported that the online auction that is currently in progress has so far raised \$2,013. Final day for bidding is December 18. The new auction platform being used has been working very well. Only need noted so far is to refine the payment process. We will plan to use this platform for future auctions.

Sign-up for tickets and meals for the New Year's Eve Countdown is underway. The event will be held December 31 at 8:00 pm. Deadline to purchase meals is December 18.

Bob Waterman plans to have a fundraising meeting at the beginning of the new year to plan for 2022 fundraising events.

Marc MacQueen had emailed the PC that \$700 has been donated for "special ask" for tech support so far.

**Social Justice Team:** Rev. Sarah will ask Lauren Haugh for a report for our next monthly PC meeting.

**Listening Circles**: The schedule for the Listening Circles was posted recently in the UU Updates. Five people have responded so far.

**Cash in the Plate:** The PC agreed that the Cash in the Plate for January will be for the Soupman; February Cash in the Plate will be for fuel assistance (Discretionary Fund). Rev. Sarah reported that the Discretionary Fund is stable at this point and that she has been able to allocate funds in response to requests from the community.

**Next Check-In Meeting:** The PC decided to meet on **January 5 at 7:00 p.m.** to: prepare for budget meeting; finalize Listening Circles; and begin planning for 2022-23 pledge drive.

Next monthly PC meeting is January 19 at 6:30 p.m.
