




Church Calendar



MINUTES OF THE VIRTUAL PARISH COMMITTEE MEETING July 21, 2021

Present: Jim Bonnar, Bob Waterman, Marc MacQueen, Rev. Sarah Person, Lois Aldrich, Katie Allen

<u>Minister's Report:</u> Rev. Sarah has been working on planning for the coming church year as well as working with the Pastoral Care Team in engaging with parishioners who are in need. The care team is seeking a new position, Pastoral Care Coordinator, that would oversee and work with Parish Care volunteers. The Pastoral Care Team will send draft of the position to Bob Waterman for review by the Leadership Team.

Paul Macuch, building contractor, will not be able to complete needed work by the church's original deadline due to the rain. He anticipates completing the work by September 19. A revised cost estimate will be forthcoming. If work cannot be completed in time for re-opening of church on September 12, the re-opening service will need to be held downstairs or held virtually, or both.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> Marc MacQueen reviewed the most recent Treasurer's Report for the church year ending June 30, 2021. Although we had budgeted a \$14,816 deficit for 20-21, we actually ended the year with a surplus of \$18,867. This is due to the generosity of gifts from parishioners, the hard work of those who coordinated and participated in fundraisers throughout the year, and a reduction in operational expenses during the pandemic year. Thank you to all who helped make 20-21 a fiscally strong year for the church!!

Fundraising: Bob Waterman reported that the final total for the spring auction is \$3,237!

Tony Soares and Steve Larrett are coordinating a Yard Sale to be held September 18 (or 25th pending weather). People will be able to rent tables to sell their wares, and food will also be sold. Further information will be provided in the UU Updates.

<u>Lakeville Arts Festival</u>: The festival is scheduled to be held on October 2. Applications for non-profits are due August 29. The PC discussion was centered around whether we should participate in the festival event or if there are other activities that may have similar yield with less work on the part of volunteers. Bob Waterman will email those who participated in the Lakeville Festival in the past to hear their ideas on how to proceed.

Retreat: The potential date for the PC Retreat was set for August 29, from 10:00 to 1:00. Given recent outbreaks of COVID, the decision on whether or not to have the retreat in-person is TBD. Decision to be made through email at a later date. Ideas for agenda items include: getting to know each other and church; how to be a leader/professional development; leadership as spiritual practice; discussion/review of church policies.

Church Re-Opening/Multi-Platform Ministry: Rev. Sarah has been meeting with Dan and Susan Hotchkiss and Alan Melchior to discuss strategies and estimate costs for implementing a multi- platform ministry that can offer both live and virtual access of church services. Three options were presented. Options vary according to cost/type of streaming services and level of equipment as well as various levels of copyright protections and privileges. The PC agreed to the 2nd option and authorized up to \$2,500 to purchase streaming services and tech equipment as needed to develop the platform. Steve Larrett volunteered to coordinate AV and train volunteers. Once developed, the tech team plans to evaluate during the course of the year to see how it is working and recommend any modifications. Currently, the church does not have a dedicated computer for this purpose, and Alan and Dan have been using their personal computers to manage the virtual services. The PC agreed that the church needs to have its own dedicated computer. Katie Allen offered to research the purchase of a computer for the church.

Bob Waterman suggested we put out an ask from the congregation for funds to donate toward this tech effort and will draft communication and send to the PC for review.

<u>Cash in the Plate for September:</u> Rev. Sarah reported a balance of \$10,000 in the Minister's Discretionary Fund, as there has been little call for assistance during the pandemic, mainly due to availability of COVID funds and policies. The PC agreed that the Cash in the Plate for September will go to the Discretionary Fund for now but will check with Social Justice at the end of the month to see if there is a more pressing need.

Assistant Treasurer Position: Bob Waterman reported that the Leadership Team continues outreach to fill this position.
